Because the College Ministry met online, we were able to provide a community for students living outside of the area and in some cases outside of the state. Some students, who otherwise would not have stepped foot inside a church, were introduced to the gospel by comfortably joining our Zoom meetings in a non-threatening environment. Students began serving the College ministry by providing critically important technical and audio/video support for our ZOOM meetings. Their taithfulness resulted in a greater capacity to serve and support the church's Sunday Morning online services. Although the events of this past year have not been favorable from a human standpoint, we saw that there were always opportunities to rejoice and to be thankful to God (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).



On Sunday, May 16 we will **resume** in-person meetings for the College Ministry. We have the challenge of providing a service on-site while **simultaneously** providing a live online option for those students with health concerns and for those who reside out of the local area. For the students who are able to meet in-person, we need to answer the important question, "**Why should I?**" Why should we resume meeting in-person for any type of church service or ministry when there are tons of online options and when participating over Zoom from home is more convenient and comfortable? Why meet in-person, when we can stay home and meet online? In **Hebrews 10:24-25**, we see that the "meeting together" is the main vehicle that God designed for the church "to spur one another on toward love and good deeds," and the primary way in which we "encourage one another all the more as we see the Day (Christ's return) approaching." But why can't we do this **online**?

We recognize that there was no such thing as an online option in Biblical times, but we do see throughout scripture that there are **many blessings** that come along with meeting in person:

• Blessings that come along with singing praise alongside other believers (Colossians 3:15-16)

• Restoration that comes along with physical anointing, laying on of hands and praying for each other (James 5:13-16)

The direct exercising and development of our spiritual gifts (Romans 12:4-8)

Blessings that come along with physical expressions of fellowship (2 Corinthians 13:12)

• Encouragement and building up of the body through the united hearing of God's Word and fellowship (Acts 2:42)

Benefits from the truest expression of loving deeds toward one another (1 John 3:18)



This list is by no means exhaustive, but we believe that Scripture is clear on the spiritual benefits of meeting physically in-person. Though we are excited to resume meeting in-person and to enjoy the fellowship that we experienced over a year ago, we do realize that it will be a gradual process to "getting back to normal." We realize that there are still safety and health concerns that loom over the world. We desire to serve both those who are able and unable to meet inperson. So we covet the prayers of the entire GVBC church family as we begin the road to experiencing fellowship that God designed for the body of Christ. Yes! We've reopened and we'd love to worship with you live!

For God So Loved the World - GVBC Missions Zoom Seminar - April 23, 2021

This special Missions seminar highlighted our partnership with these missionaries and their strategies for spreading the gospel. GVBC has sent teams for the past several years. 56 zoom screens participated with:

- Phillip and Corenne Smith, Hope Unlimited, Brazil (video)
- Pastor Makito Matsuda of Oasis Chapel of Rifu, Japan
- · Mike and Becky Mann, ABC missionaries to Thailand

The Smiths sent a heartfelt message from Hope Unlimited as they endeavor to rescue at-risk youth in Brazil who would otherwise perish in their bleak and dire situation.





Western approach which emphasizes speedy conversions to Christ. Japanese Christians must share their faith in a culturally sensitive way that often takes time and perseverance. To build genuine life-on-life relationships with their neighbors is an essential part of making disciples.

The Manns shared about their work with the Thailand Lahu Baptist churches and the Karen Baptist churches. They serve as a resource in agriculture, health, education, and water. Mike Mann told his story of studying agriculture in college to use this knowledge in Thailand. He had to switch gears to learn the nuts and bolts of engineering water projects for the ITDP (Integrated Tribal Development Foundation). Over 300 water projects have since been completed for rural villages in Thailand.



Makito-sensei explained the "Mt Fuji" approach of evangelism and discipleship in Japan. It is a slow maturing process of evangelism unlike the


Sanctuary Renovation Update

This year, GVBC will be shifting our focus from reaching out to children **globally** with Operation Christmas Child to reaching out to children **locally** at an elementary school here in Gardena.

Our global outreach arm will continue on primarily through our Advent Conspiracy projects in Japan, Brazil, and Thailand. These have well positioned our church for long-term and accountable missionary work across the world. However, we have become aware of the need to apply the same mission strategy locally across the street.

In Acts 1:8, Jesus commissions his disciples with a strategic way to spread the gospel, which is the geographical outline for all the book of Acts:

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

In other words, the gospel starts with our **neighbors**. Then, the same power that brings the peace of God to our neighbors will become a **testimony** of the power that changes the world.





GVBC, say hello to: Gardena Chapman Elementary School



Just a **5 minute drive** from church. Down Western. Left on Marine. The student population is racially diverse, and, as a Title 1 school, 75% of the students receive free/reduced lunches. This early August, our goal will be to help provide every Chapman student a new school backpack filled with needed supplies: pencil box, crayons, markers, colored pencils, and glue sticks. 420 backpacks. 420 students. 420 families. 420 neighbors.

It is important to understand that, working locally with a school, we may not be as explicit... as we may want to be. It is often more effective

to show the love of Christ through actions before saying anything. This is really just the first step in a growing long-term relationship between a local church and a local school—our opportunity to touch the lives of over 400 families in our city with the love of Jesus Christ.
