



CyBC History Book

After many years, the GVBC 100th Anniversary History Book has finally been released. We caught up with the author, Adam Marshall, to talk about the journey to publication.

How did you get involved in writing the history of GVBC?





I began by circulating a history of Bode, California that I owned among the History Committee. That was my model for this book. I also read a fair amount about Japanese American History in general, and specifically about the Evacuation during World War II. I then focused on Southern California and specifically the South Bay and Gardena. GVBC does not have an extensive collection of documents about the church's history because they were lost during the Evacuation. Most of the paper trail came from ABCOFLASH (ABCLA) files. I spent a couple of days scanning documents: letters between GVBC and the Baptist leadership in LA, church bulletins, memos, etc. I also interviewed and recorded around 35 church members and used their memories to build the narrative.

As you conducted your research, what did you discover about the church that was most surprising?

The founding pastors of GVBC (Issei) stood out for making deep sacrifices and persevering through hardship. The newspapers of their day did not champion Japanese immigrants and identified them as a threat to white farmers, among other things.

The **ten families** who guaranteed the church's loan with their **own property** during the 1960s also stood out as examples of great faith.

Did researching and writing about the history of GVBC strengthen your faith in any way?

The **personal interviews** connected me most with the faith of GVBC'ers. I didn't know many of them well before talking to them, but I got to know them better as we spoke. **The Evacuation** shattered a lot of lives: some lost every penny they had, and some lost businesses or were unable to finish college degrees. People decided afterward about how to pick up the pieces and **start over**. We can't control our circumstances, but we do **make choices** about what to do with negative experiences.

The GVBC 100th Anniversary History book will be available for purchase in the Courtyard after church service on selected dates in November and December. Adam Marshall will be signing copies at that time. It will also be available for pickup at the church office or by mail order.

This has obviously been a difficult time for all, but I want to share a quick story of how God is still at work despite our **limitations**. As a pastor, I have been feeling a little disappointed about how it seemed our opportunities to do ministry have been very limited.

With online services, we are **unable to minister** in the same ways as before, and our in-person services have been moved outside - which I figure would be far from ideal considering how unpredictable our neighborhood can be (that is the nice way of putting it). But I have been amazed how God has been using the **outside service** to draw people! Quite often we have people walking by, stop and sit down and participate in the service.

One couple, stopped as they walked their dog, and so enjoyed the service that they came back again the next week and have been regulars now for the past few months. Just this past Sunday, she stood up in service and gave testimony through tears about how God had really been using this in her life - about how she had been going through a time of extreme emotional distress and God really met her through these service times and how He has proved to be her very real strength and her shield. She has since begun coming to our weekly bible study.

This brought out the truth to me which I needed to be reminded of: when we are feeling limited, our God is completely **UNLIMITED** in what He can do! Thank you so much for your continued support of Citylights Church! Our mighty God is still at work, changing lives and drawing people to Himself.

Ectober & November Board Updates

At the October Board meeting, the Board decided that for better transparency and communication, the summary news of the monthly board meetings should be shared with the congregation; and the Spirit was the first choice. Expect monthly submissions from the Board from now on. Perry (Moderator) reviewed the following submission.



October Board Meetings News:

- The Board approved the membership applications for 4 new members.
- The Board received a letter of resignation from a Board member.
- After contacting the L.A. District Counsel of the Small Business Administration (SBA), it was determined that there are no viable means to contribute to the PPP loan, and it is only by acts of Congress that appropriations can be made.
- The Board discussed and approved the 2022 published budget.
- Guest Relations submitted an application and was awarded a federal grant to upgrade our church's security, which would pertain to specific facility security upgrades.
- Per our constitution, the Board reviewed and approved the Moderator, and the 3 designated representatives for the Pastoral Relations Committee, Personnel Committee, and Board of Deacons/Nihongo Ministry to the Pastoral Search Committee; and recommended 3 at-large members for congregational approval.

November Board Meetings News:

- Finances: January to October 2021 donations were about the same as donations in the same period in 2020. As of 9/30/21, we have a \$218K surplus for 2021 which includes the \$170K PPP grant.
- The Board agreed with the Women's Ministry to discontinue any tax-deduction for any Women's Ministry scholarship because of more than adequate funding. Likewise, the two existing Women's Ministry scholarships will be combined into the Women's Ministry Scholarship.
- The Board approved distribution and selling of the GVBC 100-year history book for \$10 each.
- We chose a realtor to represent our church to help us deal with our parking mitigations.
- The Board voted to revise the published 2022 budget to accommodate the demand for hybrid services.
