Dear GVBC Family,

Ephesians 4:11-13

So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

For several months now, our Evangelism Ministry and Neighborhood Ministry have been in talks to merge together and form a new GVBC Core Ministry called: Local Missions. This merger made a lot of sense as both Evangelism and Neighborhood have been working closely with the City of Gardena. As a result, starting next year, the strategic outreach arm of GVBC will be simplified into 2 zones: Local Missions and Global Missions. We believe this will help to create a common vision and uniform strategy across all mission efforts at GVBC.

There will be two major initial emphases for GVBC Local Missions. First, we want to build transforming relationships with our local community. Over the last 10 years, GVBC Global Missions has been able to create long-term, strategic, and transforming relationships with missionary partners in Japan, Brazil, and Thailand. We are praying that God would reveal this not just globally, but also locally. So, Local Missions will seek to build long-term, strategic, and transforming relationships with local focal points like: our local city, a local school, a local park, and even perhaps a local city block.





Second, we want to equip every GVBCer to be a local missionary. We believe that all of us are called to be local missionaries. The tendency for evangelism ministries in most churches is that the evangelism ministry does all the evangelism. But in actuality, what we learn from Ephesians 4:11-13 is that evangelism ministry is meant to equip all the rest of us to do the work of evangelism. To that end, we will be launching a Local Missions course for all GVBCers to take. This course will be customized to GVBC's unique calling in sharing the gospel in our local context of Gardena and the South Bay. We would like for every one of us to take this course.

All that to say, you are a local missionary. Did you know that? We want to equip you and send you out on the greatest mission on earth: to love your neighbors well and share with them the good news of Jesus Christ. Please pray with your loved ones and your community groups about getting involved with local missions and let's transform Gardena and the South Bay together.

This has been a season of multiple transitions for Jenna Ikemoto as she begins her credential program at CSUDH in mathematics, moves from the college ministry group to the young adult group and transitions in her role with Children's Ministry. Each of these transitions have occurred during the pandemic that began in March

2020 and the grounding of Jenna's faith in His constancy has enabled her to encounter each of these changes with calmness and acceptance.

Her **biggest uncertainty** is securing a **student observer assignment** as a number of school districts are curtailing in person options for student observers. Yet even with this, Jenna has remained faithful that God will continue to provide, guide and support her during her educational journey.

Her career path was made clearer when Jenna was in 8th grade math. Her teacher integrated kinesthetic singing, dancing and rhythms into the mathematic curriculum which were used to explain the concepts but also made learning engaging and fun. Jenna pinpoints this eye-opening experience that learning math could be exciting and it marked the beginning of her interest in the possibility of teaching math.

Another aspect of Jenna's journey of faith is a sense of **gratitude**. The **Abe family** invited Jenna to GVBC in the 5th grade. She has been able to cultivate a number of close relationships as she moved through the children's ministry program, to the high school and college group led by **Brad Toy**. Recognizing her servant's heart, **Susan Wakuta** enlisted Jenna to work alongside **Julie Fong** and **Daniel Wang** in children's ministry and also in VBS.

Jenna recently made the transition from the college group into a weekly Friday night young adult Bible study group facilitated by Wesley Shiozaki and Aaron Kuratani. Currently they are studying the book of John. On the alternate week, the group plays assorted games via zoom. They get to know one another, communicate and bond using assorted software. The games require strategy and teamwork which adds another dimension to the fellowship among young adult members.

A deep sense of gratitude and of awe figures prominently in Jenna's life. CSUDH's program focuses on the diversity of the surrounding communities. In her role as a future educator, she is culturally sensitive to those students she has worked with. She regards each of her students as individuals with unique needs just as each of us are known by God. Jenna recalled a TED Talk lecturer speaking about his teaching experience in a school in an impoverished community in which children encountered very complex difficulties. "I feel like so many things were provided to me and I also recognize how so many others are not as fortunate. I want to be there to support these kids because I have been so blessed myself." As the final edits were made on her profile, God's plan for Jenna's path were made clear. She received news that she is assigned as a student observer in the classroom of her 8th grade teacher who inspired her nearly 10 years ago.




Citylights, Long Beach
